



Jeff has increased ICP and requires evacuation to the nearest hospital capable of neurosurgery; any delay could prove fatal. Jeff's spine may also be injured. You have two options:

1. Improvise a backpack or bike carry and move Jeff to your vehicle, then transport him to the hospital; if possible, call for an ambulance to meet you en route. Do your best to support his spine, especially his neck, from abrupt, uncontrolled movement during the carry; consider improvising a soft cervical collar. (If you choose to improvise a collar, do it fast and make sure your collar does not compromise his airway.)
2. If you cannot physically carry Jeff, leave him on his side with his father and quickly ride to your vehicle. One person should continue towards town and cell service in order to call for evacuation assistance; the other should grab a sleeping bag, pad, and bivy sack and head back to Jeff and his father. Once there, put Jeff in the sleeping bag and bivy sack and on the pad, and wait for help to arrive.
