



Jamie has:

- 1 A severe concussion: he lost consciousness and is now awake with no memory of the event. He has a severe headache (7), appears dazed, and has balance problems when standing and walking.
- 2 A possible spine injury and cord injury at C-3: he failed the Focused Spine Assessment (FSA) due to mid-line spine tenderness at C-3, neck pain (4) and, electric-like pain shooting down his right arm when he moves his head.
- 3 A nasal and zygomatic fracture: his septum is slightly deformed, he has difficulty breathing through his nose, and has numbness in his upper lip and gums.
- 4 Is a non-fatal drowning patient: he was rescued unresponsive from the water with no respirations. Rescue breathing was successful and Jamie is a candidate for delayed pulmonary edema during the next 3-6 hours.

Begin a Level 2 evacuation to the nearest hospital. Given his injuries, self-evacuation is not an option and he will need to be carried out of the river gorge. Contact the local sheriff's office and request assistance from their Search & Rescue team. Monitor Jamie for wet lung sounds and respiratory distress (pulmonary edema) and vomiting (increased ICP). As long as he remains awake with clear lungs and does not fall and further injure his neck, he has a good chance for a complete recovery.
